MATERIALS:

1/8 yard Quilt Block Denim
1/2 yard Quilt Block Khaki
1/2 yard Quilt Block Garnet
1/2 yard Quilt Block Forest
1/4 yard Words Gold
1/4 yard Words Garnet
1 yard Blender Navy for Binding and Backing
Batting, at least 30" x 68"

READ THROUGH ALL INSTRUCTIONS BEFORE BEGINNING. SEW PIECES RIGHT SIDES TOGETHER (RST) AND USE A 1/4" SEAM

ALLOWANCE THROUGHOUT. WOF = WIDTH OF FABRIC; WS = WRONG SIDE OF FABRIC; RS = RIGHT SIDE OF FABRIC

CUTTING INSTRUCTIONS:

From Quilt Block Denim Fabric:

Cut [1] — 4" x WOF" strip
Subcut [8] — 4" squares **(A)**

From Quilt Block Forest Fabric:

Cut [1] — 4" x WOF" strip
Subcut [8] — 4" squares **(A)**
Cut [4] — 2-1/2" x WOF" strips for border
Subcut [2] — 2-1/2" x 16" rectangles
Subcut [2] — 2-1/2" x 18-1/2" rectangles
Subcut [2] — 2-1/2" x 36-1/2" rectangles

From Quilt Block Garnet Fabric:

Cut [2] — 4" x WOF" strip
Subcut [18] — 4" squares **(A)**
Cut [1] — 5-1/4" x WOF" strip
Subcut [1] — 5-1/4" square, cut once diagonally **(C)**
Subcut [4] — 4" squares, cut once diagonally **(B)**

From Quilt Blocks Khaki Fabric:

Cut [3] — 4" x WOF" strip
Subcut [24] — 4" squares **(A)**
Subcut [8] — 4" squares, cut once diagonally **(B)**

From Words Gold Fabric:

Cut [1] — 3-1/2" x WOF" strip
Subcut [8] — 3-1/2" squares **(D)**
Cut [1] — 4" x WOF" strip
Subcut [4] — 4" squares **(A)**

From Words Garnet Fabric:

Cut [1] — 7" x WOF" strip
Subcut [4] — 7" squares, cut once diagonally **(E)**

BLOCK ASSEMBLY:

END UNITS

1. Line up [1] Quilt Block Khaki **(B)** under [1] Quilt Block Garnet **(B)** with 90 degree corners opposite of each other on the right side and diagonals crossing each other. 3/8" of Khaki should be showing above the Garnet at the top. Sew along the right side. Make [4]. Press open or to one side. Trim dog ears if you prefer.



2. Sew [2] of the units from Step 1 together as shown. Press open or to one side.



3. Sew the diagonal of [1] Words Garnet **(E)** to the diagonal of the unit from Step 2 next to the Quilt Block Khaki. This will need to be done with both Sets that were sewn.



4. Next, repeat the process in Steps 1-3, however now line up [1] Quilt Block Garnet **(B)** under [1] Quilt Block Khaki Piece **(B)** with 90 degree corners opposite of each other on the right side and diagonals crossing each other. 3/8" of Khaki should be showing above the Garnet at the top. Sew along the right side. Make [4]. Trim dog ears if you prefer. Press open or to one side.



- Sew [2] of the unit from Step 4 together as shown. Press open or to one side.



- Sew the diagonal of [1] Words Garnet (E) to the diagonal of the unit from Step 5 next to the Quilt Block Khaki. This will need to be done with both Sets that were sewn.



- Sew [1] unit from Step 3 and [1] from Step 6 together. Make [2].



- Sew Quilt Block Garnet (C) to Unit from Step 7 to create the point. Use a ruler to trim off the dog ears.



- Sew [1] 2-1/2" x 16" Quilt Block Forest on one side of the triangle unit from Step 8. Repeat for the second triangle unit. **These are sewn on the bias, be sure not to stretch the fabric.**
- Sew [1] 2-1/2" x 18-1/2" Quilt Block Forest on the other side of the point of the triangle unit. Repeat for the second triangle unit.
- Borders will need to be trimmed on the diagonal side.



CENTER UNITS

- Sew [2] HST at a time using [1] Quilt Block Denim 4" square (A) and [1] Quilt Block Forest 4" square (A). Repeat to make [16] HSTs. Trim to 3-1/2" square. Reserve 8 HSTs for Outer Units.
- Sew [2] HST at a time using [1] Quilt Block Garnet 4" square (A) and [1] Quilt Block Khaki 4" square (A). Repeat to make [28] HSTs. Trim to 3-1/2" square. Reserve 12 HSTs for Outer Units.
- Sew [2] HST at a time using [1] Quilt Block Khaki 4" square (A) and [1] Words Gold 4" square (A). Repeat to make [8] HSTs. Trim to 3-1/2" square.



- Line up [1] Denim/Forest HST, [1] Garnet/Khaki HST, and one Khaki/Gold HST to sew Row 1.



- Line up [1] Garnet/Khaki HST, [1] Words Gold 3-1/2" Square [D], and [1] Garnet/Khaki HST to sew Row 2.



- Line up [1] Khaki/Gold HST, [1] Garnet/Khaki HST, and [1] Denim/Forest to sew Row 3.



- Sews all rows together. Center Unit should measure 9-1/2" square. Make [4].

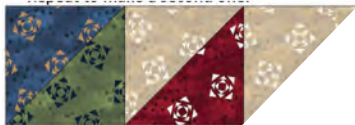


OUTER UNITS

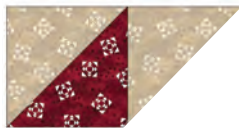
1. Line up [1] Words Gold 3-1/2" square **(D)**, [1] Denim/Forest HST, and [1] Garnet/Khaki HST to sew Row 1. Press as desired.



2. Line up [1] Denim/Forest HST, [1] Garnet/Khaki HST, and [1] Quilt Block Khaki **(B)** to Sew Row 2. Press as desired.



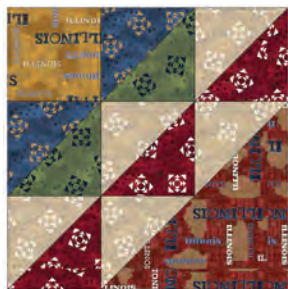
3. For Row 3 line up [1] Garnet/Khaki HST and [1] Quilt Block Khaki [B]. Press as desired.



4. Sew all rows together. Clip dog ears if desired.



5. Sew the diagonal of [1] Words Garnet **(E)** to the lower right diagonal of the unit created in Step 4. Press as desired. Outer Unit should measure 9-1/2" square. Make [4].



ASSEMBLY:

1. Sew [2] of the Outer Units together as shown. Make [2].



2. Sew [2] of the Center Units together so the Word Gold creates a flying geese and the Denim on one is next to the Forest on the other. Make [2].



3. Sew the length of the units made in Step 2 together to form a Pinwheel in the center.



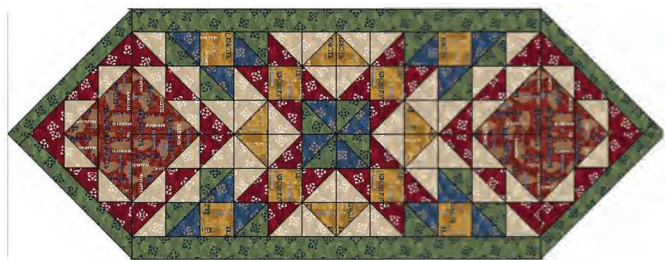
4. Sew [1] Unit from Step 1 on each side the unit made in Step 3 making sure the Word Gold and Quilt Block Garnet Flying Geese points are touching.

BORDERS:

1. Sew $2\frac{1}{2}" \times 36\frac{1}{2}"$ border strips on each long side of the Table Runner.



2. Sew End Units to each end of the Table Runner. It will lay best if you press open. Trim the excess from the border.



FINISHING:

1. Sandwich with backing and batting.
2. Quilt
3. Bind as desired.
4. Enjoy!

TIP: If you have a need for an 18" or 22" table topper you can make a second of the unit ending at Step 4 of Assembly. Use it alone and bind or adding a border before binding.
